Environmental Policy

Cross Counties Farm Vets (CCFV) is a veterinary practice which specialises in farm animals with a mix of dairy, beef and sheep farms, as well as smallholders. We were formed in 2021 after a merger between Westpoint Daventry and Broughton Veterinary Group and now have a team of 8 vets, 1 vet tech and 2 admin staff. The main farm office is based at Elkington Lodge, Welford, however we also part of Broughton Veterinary Group who have two small animal branches at Lutterworth and Broughton Astley.

At CCFV our aim is to provide farmers with the best clinical and advisory service with the resources available to us and to assist farmers to maximise the health and productivity of their livestock. We have a full team approach, to help us provide the best service, competitively priced medicines, and specialist services including TB Testing and export work.

We acknowledge that our operations have an effect on the environment and have identified our key environmental aspects that contribute to our environmental and carbon footprint:

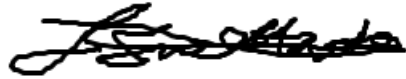
Our environmental commitment can be demonstrated in our established objectives and goals below:
